St. James welcomes Mother Mary Ann Garrett

Mother Mary Ann Garrett will join St. James' staff as Associate Rector for Pastoral Care and, in a few months, begin developing Hispanic Ministry at St. James.

Mary Ann grew up the second of three daughters of the only doctor in the East Texas oil field town of Van.

Raised Methodist, Mary Ann fell in love with the liturgy and practice of the Episcopal Church in high school and worshipped at Christ Church, Tyler, with a dear friend there.

Following graduation from UT Austin with a degree in Spanish Literature and studying at North Texas State University to earn a teaching credential, Mary Ann wound up teaching in Brownsville, the southernmost city in

Texas and on the Mexican border, in a federal project for high school dropouts and later teaching English at nearby Harlingen High School.

Travel and living in various parts of the United States and Mexico eventually led Mary Ann to Cuba, where as a member of the Diocese of Florida, foreign mission captured her heart.

Back in Texas, Mary Ann continued mission work, going to Honduras, Mexico, Uruguay and Ecuador, and leading teams to Cuba. She completed EFM studies and a Master of Arts in Religious

Studies at Incarnate Word in San Antonio then went to Seabury Western Theological Seminary where she graduated with a Masters of Divinity in 2002.

The day after graduation, Mary Ann and William – Bill - Ashby were married at Seabury and went on a first honeymoon to Jamaica and a second to Ciudad Juarez the week after to build houses for the poor.

Then in February 2003, Mary Ann, who is outgoing and energized by meeting others, moved to

Mexico at the invitation of Bishop Benito Juarez, of the Diocese of Southeast Mexico, to establish a church. Holy Trinity Oaxaca came into being, and Mary Ann spent the ensuing five years building up the church, being pastor and priest in charge of the congregation there.

During this time the opportunity presented itself to begin another mission church in the neighboring state of Chiapas. Mary Ann and Holy Trinity Oaxaca committed to pastoral care of that evolving congregation. She dedicated herself to its support. There she has welcomed, baptized, and brought teams – two from St. James' Baton Rouge, one from Metairie, and one from Texas - to build a church. This mission continues. In conjunction with the church in San Cristobal, Mary Ann has also worked with Hogar Infantil, a children's home

St. Alban's Supports WE CARE

"A hands-on outreach experience for children at St. Alban's was the goal of a summer Sunday program," reports Deacon Linda Armstrong.

The congregation was asked to bring specific food items or provide a cash donation. "My expectation was for the children to make about 50 bags," says Linda. "Thanks to the generosity of St. Alban's congregation and the enthusiasm of the children we prepared 200 bags," she joyfully reported.

We Care is a downtown outreach ministry of St. James to provide a brown bag meal for homeless persons. About 250 bags are distributed each week from the Ministries Center. The ministry began in 2004 and is chaired by Warren and Boots Green.

The brown bags contain a canned meat, fruit or pudding, peanut butter crackers, and a bottle of water. Each bag costs about \$1.75. The devoted contributions by parishioners sustain this ministry and by a grant from the St. James Christian Outreach Committee.

St. James Day School fifth graders fill bags on Fridays during the school year, and volunteers come forward each week with money, food items, or a willingness to fill bags. Truly, this is a lay ministry where "God Will Provide" food for the hungry.

Summer Renovations Underway at Day School

A major project is well underway in Werlein Hall to completely re-tile the first and second floors as well as the stairway treads. The most impressive project is a complete renovation of all restrooms used by students and teachers.

Each restroom will be re-tiled on the floor and walls before installing new modern fixtures suitable for young children. Architect Chuck Oliver says, "We found most of the drains have completely disintegrated. The rooms are cobbled together, sloppy looking, and hard to maintain."

Hand dryers will be installed in all restrooms because, Chuck reports, "Quite a bit of money has been spent on Roto-Rooter because of paper towels clogging the toilets."

The men's and women's restrooms are being interchanged to provide more room for the predominantly female staff.

The restrooms in Atkinson Hall will be renovated in the fall. Parishioner Rennie Carter is the contractor. Fr. Mark comments while joyfully showing the construction, "This work on the restrooms and stairs is long overdue."
