## OUTREACH COMMITTEE MAKES ANNUAL GRANTS

Part 1 of a series by Phillip Wright

Twenty grants have been authorized by the St. James Outreach Committee totaling more than \$50,000. The focus is on children in our community though several grants are for adult programs and those in need far beyond Baton Rouge. Our own St. James ministries received funding to continue feeding of the poor and for needy children.

While our parish is blessed with the ability to share our good fortune with others, we are strengthened by the words of Winston Churchill, "We make a living by what we earn, we make a life by what we give."

### Children Programs

Several parishioners participate in the **Volunteers in Public Schools' Everybody Reads** program. A grant was made to support its teaching of grammar school children. The **Cinderella Project** was

awarded monies to purchase prom dresses in sizes that are not received through donations.

**Boys & Girls Club** will now be able to hold a summer arts program at the Alaska Street Club, and **Arc Baton Rouge** will be able to hire two caregivers to assist six children with disabilities attending BREC's summer camp programs.

Other school programs funded include the Federation of Churches and Synagogues' **Kids Café** after-school feeding program. **Desire Street Ministry** was funded to purchase 100 school jackets for boys in need.

### Adult Programs

The Committee thoughtfully included a wide range of adult needs in our community.

## Relation of St. James to Jesus

Some authors, comparing the gospels of John with Matthew and with Mark, identify four women in the gospels. Mary, the Mother of James the Less, is probably the same person as "Mary of Cleophas" as recorded in John.

The name of Mary Magdalene occurs in each gospel. A fourth woman, Salome, is also named in these gospels. She is identified in Mark as "the mother of the sons of Zebedee;" and as "his mother's sister" in John.

If this supposition is right, Salome was a sister of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and James the Greater and John were first cousins of Jesus.

This may explain the discipleship of the two brothers, James and John, who quickly joined with Jesus at the Sea of Galilee, and of Salome's request, and their own claim, to the first position in His kingdom.

In their petition to Jesus the brothers asserted they were willing to drink the chalice that He drinks of, and to be baptized with the baptism of His sufferings. Jesus assured them that they will share His sufferings (Mark 5:38-39).

James won the crown of martyrdom fourteen years after the Lord's prophecy. On the occasion

of the Passover of A.D. 44, Herod Agrippa I, grandson of Herod the Great, perpetrated cruelties upon the Church, whose rapid growth incensed the Jews.

Agrippa chose James, a leader in the Christian community, as the first victim. "He killed James, the brother of John, with the sword." (Acts 12:1-2) This explains why the church symbol of St. James include a sword.

She also sends thanks to all who purchased tickets in the CPC Quilt Raffle. Another \$159.00 was raised in this effort from St. James.

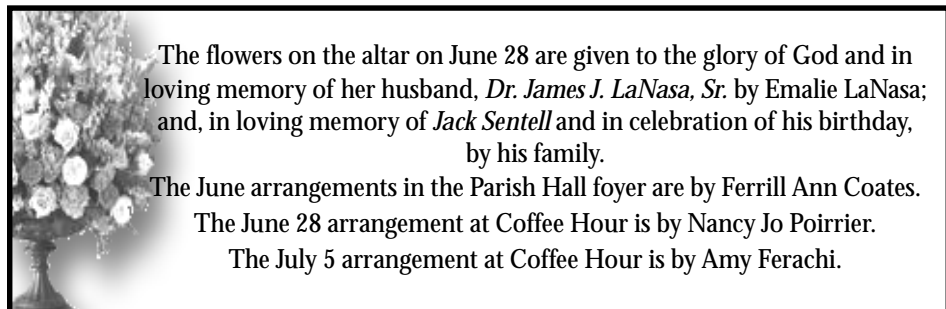
## Office News

**Cancer Services** received a major grant to support the salary of an exercise instructor for the Fit & Fearless program offered to cancer survivors. **Hospice of Baton Rouge** will now be able to develop needed bereavement literature through a St. James outreach grant.

Funding was also provided for a cost sharing program with **Volunteers of America** to develop a foster parent recruiting video. The **Capital Area Family Violence Intervention Center** will receive support for transportation and first month's rent for battered women.

**O'Brien House** will again receive monies for continuing its Life Skills Training program to teach budgeting, job interviewing, and accepting personal responsibility by those returning to independent living.

Outreach Committee co-chair Melanie Clark says, "While we are confident of good stewardship by each receiver, the committee is requesting a six-month report on how success is measured and the number of persons affected."

Part two of the Outreach report will focus on outreach programs within our parish family.
