September Vestry Highlights

Pledge contributions continue to trail last year and budget projections. At the end of August, 51% of pledges are outstanding compared to 45% at the same time last year. With careful management expenses are below budget. Parking lot income is well above budget.

Fr. Mark reported the physical plant suffered significant damage during the recent hurricanes. Our property insurer, Church Mutual, responded quickly to our needs, especially for water in the church and ministries center. All five buildings were damaged. The church and Bishops Hall are expected to require an entirely new slate roof.
